

When Sogyal Rinpoche the Tibetan Lama first came to England he was asked what was his first impression - he replied that he was dismayed at the lack of respect for the Elderly. For years now I have held the belief that our way of life is becoming untenable. Pressure is on governments to rethink Urban Planning, Aged Care Provision, care for our Children & the Disabled.

We cannot afford to maintain such things as:

- Child Care costs
- After school Care
- The expense of Private & Govt care for our Elders & increasingly the Disadvantaged generally
- the unsustainable dependence on the Health system

To have assets & Family Homes to pass on to future Generations & to prevent Finances being irretrievably eroded by Institutional Care; the Beneficiaries will need to be involved, contribute to, & become tangibly responsible for the maintenance of the Needy within groups & communities.

We need to move back to the old ways where Families & Groups of like minded people learn once again to provide Mutual Support. Although this is beginning, we feel that specifically designed housing could be desirable.

- The Elders could spend time sharing their accrued knowledge & experience with the ensuing Generations who in turn learn respect over all age groups. This creates the basis for an effective Society framework.
- Home Care will continue to increase (by converting houses it will enable people to remain in their own homes for longer)
- People generally would prefer to upgrade the Existing home to accommodate Elders & disabled in their own home rather than consigning them to a care institution

There are many 'warnings' in the Media about the way our Society is heading. All new housing should be designed with this information in mind.


- It is forecast in the future, families will decrease to one child only.
- The Young are to a great extent preferring to use Public Transport over driving a car, which enables them to use their electronic devices - Phones etc... (this apparently perverse anti-social development could actually help to solve some Pollution & Infrastructure problems in our Cities by a reduction in Car Numbers)

Peter Cosgrove predicts a looming reality of Australia's Ageing. Demographic, saying we are far from battle ready for the onslaught of Old Age.


He has become part of the "Sandwich Generation" - caring for a Relative in Age Care while still having an Adult Child at Home

Parents could soon be joined in Care Facilities by their unhealthy children, all of whom lack adequate support services

At this stage one in two people live in households of two or more generations of related adults




Ground Floor Plan



Generational House

My proposal is most likely more than many people could or would be prepared to build.

- What I propose may cause people, families, Investors or even Developers to think "the Future" & more deeply about what they build. There could be strategic Sub-Division & Planning which would enable Developers & Investors to build flexible housing along the lines I am proposing.
- for those endeavouring to provide for the second half of life, where a mix of ages could care for & support one another. Renters or Buyers could move into a Stand-Alone House, or a Generational Complex, or Shared Accommodation.
- For this project, our friend Corrie Wright became our Virtual Client [see Client Brief] as she is an Artist, her major requirement was for a Studio. It rapidly became apparent that as a space with a full bathroom, it could be utilised as a living space - Home Office, Older Children if this became a need, or maybe a Rentable Flat.
- I deferred to my Townplanner friend, Malcolm Holtz, on his proposal for possible New Residential Sub-Divisions. He suggested small lots with zero lot Lines - 24 meters setback from the road, & rear access Laneway.
- I decided to build the complex on two adjoining sites. For flexibility, which allows for one property to be sold should the need arise.
I settled for:
Site 1 - 25 m x 12 m (300 sq. m.)
Site 2 - 25 m x 10m (250 m. sq.)
- I have a Bedsit in Lieu of Carparking on Site 1. which could be accommodation for maybe a Family Member, or Live-in Caret, or may be a Student.
- With the possibility of Parents & their children both needing care, we have designed the entire complex to be care friendly.
- A large Courtyard separates the site, with part of it being grass as open space, for Play/Outdoor recreation area.
- To preserve site space, & at the same time soften & insulate the complex, vertical gardens have been included.
- Vegetable gardens would give purpose & recreation to all ages.
- Solar panels would be installed on the roof of the Grandparents house. water storage would be provided under the raised decks.
(The buildings are raised as I am not a believer in slab-on-ground-termites etc.)
- A plunge pool provides respite from summer heat & another recreation area.
- Corrie's brief stipulated the importance of quiet, I have answered this by providing small tuck away spaces which I call "Meditation Retreats" which have a bunk bench, where people can be on their own & enjoy their solitude.
- Floors & walls will need to be adequately sound proofed.
- Careful separation of modules will in itself provide a level of insulation.
- All of these modules could be factory built as flat packs or transportable modules
- The "Small House Range" of which one forms part of this exhibition, could be designed for exactly this purpose.




The Complex is designed to meet










